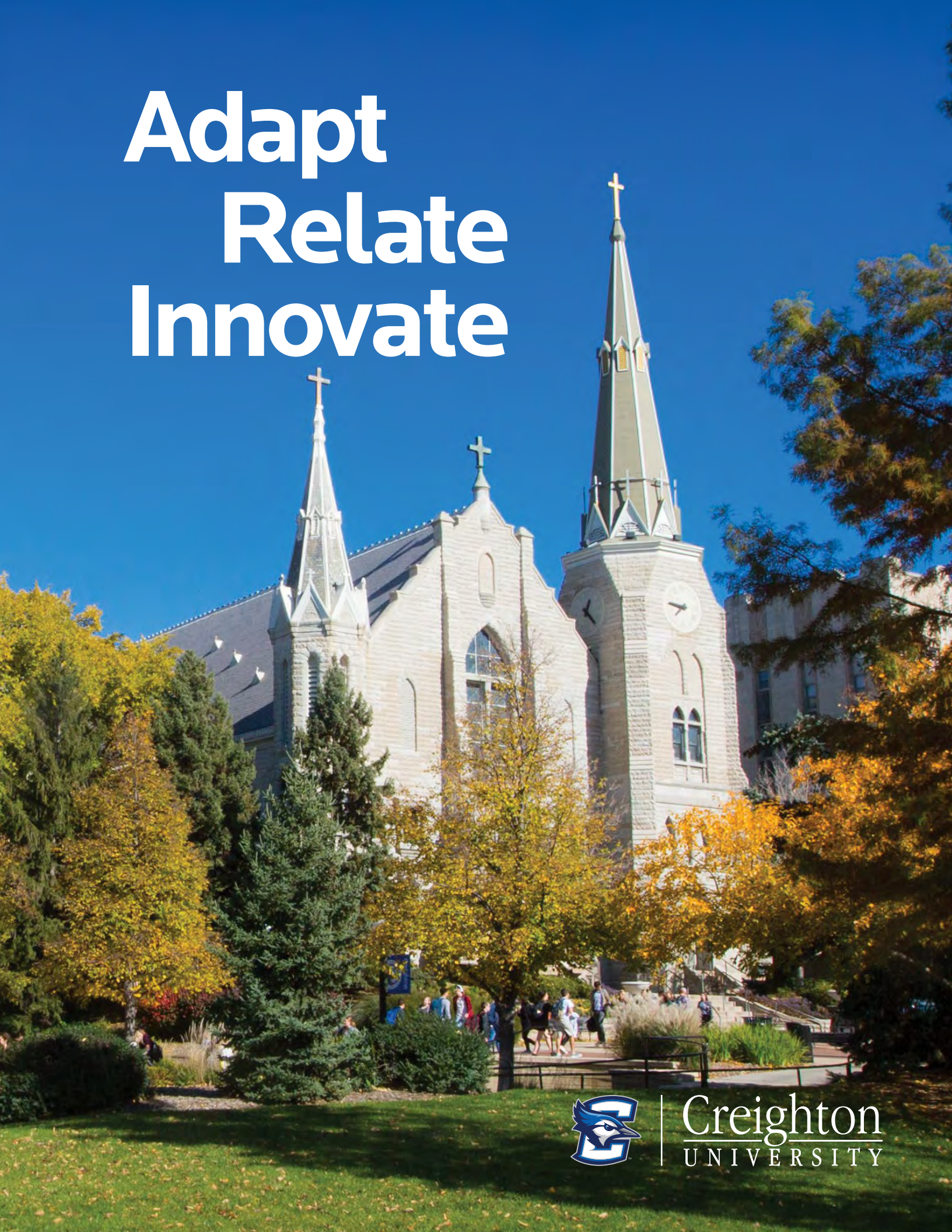

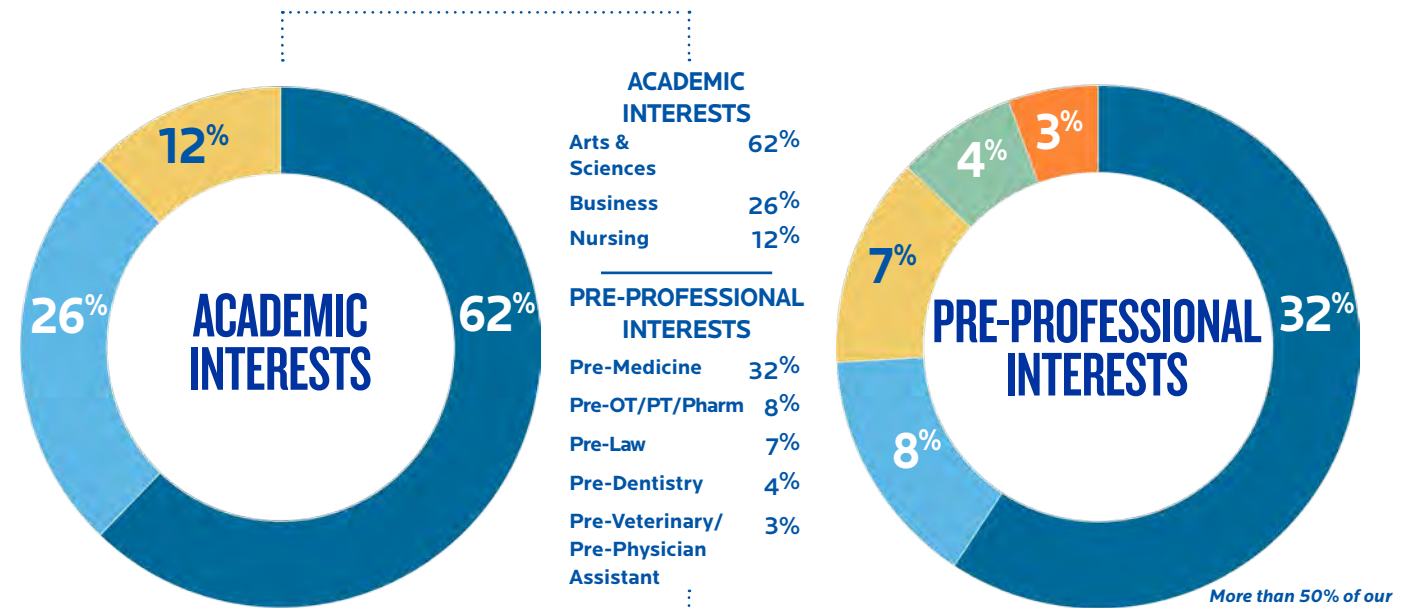

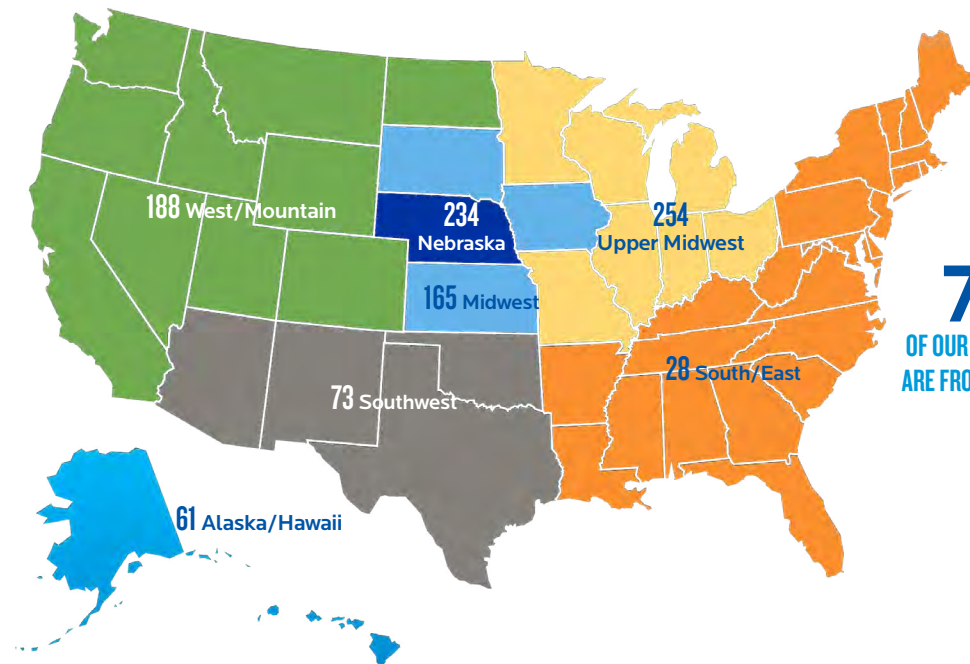


2020 Freshman Profile & Geographic Distribution

COMPETITIVE SPECIAL PROGRAMS

FRESHMAN LEADERSHIP PROGRAM (FLP) – As part of FLP, you will live and learn in community, bringing your experience and passions together, to create a close-knit group dedicated to community service, leadership, peer mentoring and academics. You will be challenged to grow as a leader and to implement your leadership skills across campus and into the Omaha community.

GLOBAL SCHOLARS PROGRAM – You will complete a minimum of four global experiences, as well as a special companion seminar each semester to integrate global learning into your major. These experiences are designed to immerse you in a diverse mix of cultures, experiences and traditions that provide a rich well-traveled lens through which to focus your major studies.

SEE THE WORLD

Immerse yourself in the culture and traditions of another country. Arts and sciences students study on every continent except Antarctica. Each year, faculty lead summer courses to over 15 different countries.

Study away and explore the arts and sciences

Austria and Hungary – Immerse yourself comparing health care systems in two neighboring countries while considering the impacts of different types of care.

Backpack Journalism – Join a team of student videographers to produce a socially conscious documentary. Previous documentaries have been filmed internationally in Uganda and the Dominican Republic and domestically in Arizona and Alaska.

Camino de Santiago (Spain) – Become one of millions who have walked the steps of the Camino de Santiago, one of the most cherished Christian Pilgrimages from the Middle Ages to the present day, and earn credits in Spanish or History.

Dominican Republic – Work on an ongoing water quality research project that provides low-cost water filtration systems to our partner communities. Or serve as an *Ayudante* (student assistant) during the Summer Health Program working in community clinics.

Germany – Join students in the law school for a pre-law focused course situated in Nuremberg with a half-week excursion to The Hague, Netherlands, to meet international criminal tribunal judges and prosecutors as well as view current trials.

Ireland – Study at Trinity College Dublin learning about how 21st century Ireland preserves its historical heritage, while emerging as a force within the global community.

Peru – Participate in an academic service-learning program which connects theology, sociology and Spanish language courses with community needs in Villa El Salvador, a section of Lima, Peru.

You will focus on care management and care outcomes, health promotion, restoration, rehabilitation, self care, acute care and tertiary care.

Your education will be as adaptable as it is innovative. We have unique programs in clinical nurse leadership, health care ethics and state-of-the-art simulation.

Community involvement is at the heart of everything you'll do as a nursing student at Creighton. You'll have practical experience in helping to meet community needs through hands-on learning at free health clinics, such as the Heart Ministry Center and OneWorld in Omaha, and international sites in the Dominican Republic and across Africa and India.

INNOVATIVE PROGRAMS

Creighton is well-known for innovative programs that keep pace with the ever-changing field of nursing. Our traditional Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) will prepare you for entry-level professional nursing practice in both hospital and community-based settings.

You will complete a semester-long preceptorship, where you will work side-by-side with a BSN-prepared nurse. You'll be challenged to apply your patient-centered skills to improve patient health outcomes. During your preceptorship, you will analyze clinical problems, pose solutions and apply principles of change as the solutions are implemented in clinical areas.

We offer an accelerated bachelor of science in nursing, which can be completed in just 12 months, to students who have a non-nursing bachelor's degree or higher. The accelerated BSN is available in Omaha, central Nebraska, and Phoenix.

Internships

The Mayo Clinic summer nursing internship program is one of many competitive programs across the country for nursing students between their junior and senior years. Most summer nursing internships are paid positions and provide an excellent opportunity for students to gain invaluable experience in a number of clinical settings. These internships also provide connections for employment after graduation.

RECENT HIGHLIGHTS

- Our teams are as hard-working in the classroom as they are on the court and field. Creighton student-athletes owned a GPA of 3.48 in the spring of 2020 and earned a collective 3.40 cumulative GPA.
- Creighton had at least one NCAA Tournament team for the 33rd straight school year as the Bluejay volleyball team reached the Second Round of the NAAs. Post season bids of the men's and women's basketball teams were virtually assured before both tournaments were canceled due to COVID-19.
- Creighton men's basketball's win over No. 8 Seton Hall clinched their BIG EAST regular-season title. Ranked seventh in the preseason BIG EAST poll, the Jays finished the year ranked a best-ever seventh in the nation.
- Creighton ranked second nationally in men's soccer in average home attendance, fifth in men's basketball, 21st in volleyball and 25th in women's soccer. Each of those teams led the BIG EAST in average home attendance.
- Connor Ramlo (men's soccer), Brittany Witt (volleyball) and Nick Monkemeyer (men's cross country) were named CoSIDA Academic All-Americans.
- Five Creighton men's basketball alumni (Kyle Korver, Anthony Tolliver, Doug McDermott, Justin Patton, Khyri Thomas) played in the NBA this past season.
