Choose from 700 wine options and order a cheese board, flatbread, salad or panini to go with it.

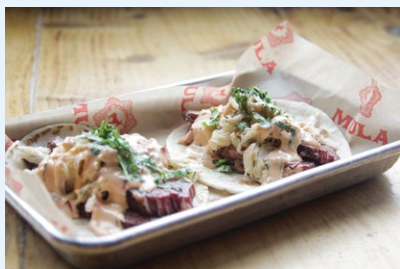
### Crescent Moon Alehouse

### **La Casa Pizzeria**

*legendary pizza and pasta since 1953*

Run by the third generation of Patane family members, still at the original location.

### **Lighthouse Pizza**

*contemporary pizza joint known  
for its oversized slices*

Ridiculously large pizza slices, fries piled high, unique topping creations, and late-night hours.

### **Lisa's Radial Café**

*classic breakfast and lunch  
diner close to campus*

Great breakfast place. Open early morning to 2 pm every day.

### **Salween Thai**

*some like it hot—go for a level  
5 or above.*

A favorite of students for the great food at fair prices and generous portions. Choose your spice level, 1-10. The Pad Thai is always a winner.

### **Stella's Bar and Grill**

## OMAHA STEAKS

### **801 Chophouse**

*sharp, white-tablecloth spot serving  
a menu of upscale steakhouse  
classics including fresh seafood*

Yes, you can find an 801 Chophouse in cities other than Omaha, but only in five, so we've included it on the list as it is a recurring favorite in the Big O.

### **Brother Sebastian's Steakhouse**

*choice cuts delivered by staff  
dressed as monks in cozy digs*

Early California mission décor with great steaks. Perfect spot for a special dinner. Reservations recommended.

### **Cascio's Steakhouse**

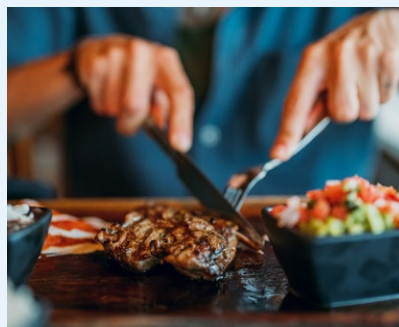
*storied family-owned bar and grill

Old-school place that never fails to deliver. Generations of the Cascio family have kept this steakhouse a perennial favorite in Omaha. Open Wednesday—Sunday.

### **The Committee Chophouse**

High-end, contemporary dining in historical digs. Reservations are recommended.



## The Drover

*landmark chophouse specializing in steaks marinated in whiskey and then grilled to order*

Well-known old-school salad bar, it's worth the short drive from campus to find The Drover. Reservations recommended.

## Gorat's Steakhouse

*local fixture offering steaks, salads and sandwiches in an old-school environment*

Warren Buffet's choice for steaks in Omaha—do you need more than that? Some gluten-free options are available.

## J. Gilberts

*wood-fired steaks and seafood*

Serves Midwestern raised, USDA Prime Black Angus beef cooked over an open wood-fire grill. Delivers a fine-dining meal in a down-to-earth atmosphere.

## Johnny's Café

*1922 chophouse highlighting Midwest beef, including steaks aged on-site*

Local, family-run steakhouse. The décor is a treat.

## Mahogany Prime Steakhouse

*upscale chophouse chain branch presenting prime beef and seafood in a white-tablecloth dining room*

Often listed as one of the top fine dining experiences in Omaha. Dinner hours only, closed Sunday. Reservations recommended.

## Monarch Restaurant

*upscale New American kitchen with weekend brunch and tasting menus in a stylish high-ceilinged space*

Classically inspired cocktails, exclusive theatre menu, and charming dining room and lounge are sure to please.

## COFFEE, PLEASE!

### 13th Street Coffee and Tea

*espresso beverages, baked goods and gelato in an airy café setup featuring rotating art on the walls*

Like Central Perk, this hang-out spot right off Old Market is a favorite. Try the cannolis.

### Archetype Coffee

*craft coffee shop with an industrial feel, emphasizing natural flavors*

Serving small batch roasted coffee, lattes, cappuccinos, macchiatos or in-house brewed chai.



### Hardy Coffee Co.

*Small-batch coffee roaster and bakery*

Sweets galore and scrumptious coffee; four locations around Omaha.

### Rally Coffee Co.

*coffees, teas, and assorted menu items*

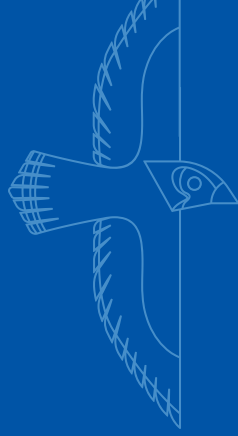
This coffee classic makes their flavorings in-house. Stop by for terrific seasonal options all year round.
